Pre-Primary teachers play a vital role in shaping the minds and characters of young children. They lay the foundation for future learning by introducing children to basic concepts, skills and values.

Pre-Primary teachers help children build confidence and self-esteem by encouraging them to try new things and praising their achievements. Teachers promote emotional intelligence in young children by teaching them to recognize, understand, and manage their emotions.

The Pre-Primary stage introduces children to the basic – building blocks of education, laying the groundwork for literacy and numeracy.

Language Skill

Introduction of Letter "Qq"

This week in class, we focused on introducing the letter "Qq" to our little learners. Through flashcards and phonic sound we introduced simple words that start with the letter "Qq," such as "queen", "quarrel" and "quilt." To reinforce learning, we engaged them in fun activities like showing them different pictures of objects that begin with "Qq," building the letter "Qq" with blocks, and tracing the letter in the air.









Mathematical Skills

Introduction of Number 7

In Math-O-Logic activity, our Nursery class children learned number 7 through numeral painting. Children practiced writing the number 7 with the help of tracing and painting.




Language Skills






