Co-curricular activities offer students valuable opportunities to develop essential life skills, including leadership, teamwork, time management, problem-solving, and communication. CCA Team is always in a pursuit to develop such skills in the students. On weekly basis they plan many activities for classes I to VIII. These activities are carried out during their regular CCA periods.

### **Classes I & II - The Clay Forge**

In this hands-on Clay Moulding Activity, students used colorful eco-friendly clay to create various shapes and models. Themes like Spring Garden, Animal Kingdom, and Food Fun offer endless creative possibilities, from flowers to animals and toys. With tools like rolling pins, craft sticks, and plastic cutters, students moulded their ideas into clay masterpieces.





### Classes III & IV - Trash to Treasure: Creative Recycling

In this activity, young creators transformed everyday trash into amazing treasures! They used their imaginations and hands, to build, design and invent using materials like plastic bottles, cardboard boxes, old newspapers, fabric scraps, and more. Students showed their creativity by making colorful collages from paper, sturdy structures from cardboard and playful toys from plastic.



### Classes V & VI - Bloom Colours: Spring Flowers Art

Spring is a season filled with vibrant colours, blooming flowers, and fresh energy. Keeping this theme in mind the students created their own "Spring Flowers Collage". They painted and crafted beautiful representations of flowers like marigolds, roses, sunflowers, and tulips. By using a variety of art materials, students not only enhanced their artistic skills but also experimented with textures, colours, and techniques.







### Classes VII & VIII - The Avian Café Project

Students created ecofriendly bird feeders to attract birds. They learnt about local bird species, and understood the importance of helping wildlife. They made feeders using empty plastic bottles, milk cartons and pinecones. They brought birdseeds and grains to feed the birds. Students then hung the feeders on various trees with strings, wires and ropes.
