Day 1 training focused on the foundational skills required for effective classroom facilitation.

Facilitation Techniques for Young Learners: Teachers were introduced to various facilitation techniques, including the use of visual aids, group discussions, and role-playing.


Day 2 focused on advanced facilitation strategies and classroom management techniques to support teachers in maintaining an organized, effective, and inclusive learning environment.


Supporting Social and Emotional Development: The resource person explained about 15 habits of mind. It includes all the stories related HOM from PSY2-PSY4.
